

# World Cup watch party map finds fellow supporters

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**The context:** Stefan and Dennis Tan built the database and map because they often travel for work and found it difficult to find a place to watch sporting events with fellow fans.

- \"The World Cup felt like the perfect moment to fix (that), because cheering alongside fellow countrymen makes it come alive even more,\" Stefan tells Axios.
- \"I am Dutch and moved to the US, so I am always hunting for the bar with orange in it (you can imagine how that goes).\"

**How it works:** Watch Party Radar aggregates websites, social media posts, and articles about venues offering viewing opportunities and makes them accessible on a map.

- No business has to sign up or pay, and it's open to users.
- [Search for your city](#), and if it's not there, the Watch Party Radar will add it.

**The intrigue:** The database started with 100 cities and around 5,000 venues, and now has more than 300 cities and 25,000 venues, Stefan says.

**Reality check:** Time matters. Since the matches are very late for some countries, finding venues that stay open late is useful.

**Plus,** fans care who else will be there. They want to cheer alongside their fellow fans from their home country and feel the collective spirit of the World Cup.
