

New map tracks Toronto watch parties

What to know

- Amsterdam startup Dashmote has launched a free interactive tool called Watch Party Radar that helps fans find World Cup screenings and watch parties in Toronto.
- The map currently lists 148 venues screening matches in Toronto, including 19 dedicated watch parties.
- Users can view venue details, event descriptions, special offers, ratings, and search by team, match, or venue type.
- The map is updated daily and will continue tracking events through the World Cup final on July 19.

As Toronto embraces the soccer mode, a new free tool is helping residents and visitors decide where to watch the World Cup matches in the city.

The soccer event of the year is one week in, and there are still 88 matches to happen in total, including five of them at the Toronto Stadium.

Whether you're looking to cheer for Canada's national team or another fan favourite, there are plenty of ways to catch the games across the city.

Interactive map reveals World Cup watch parties

To help soccer fans, residents, and visitors take part in the event and avoid missing games, Amsterdam startup [Dashmote](#) has launched a free World Cup project that allows fans to view all World Cup watch parties, including in Toronto.

The tool, named [Watch Party Radar](#), is a live interactive map that allows users to view all verified screening events and venues across the city free of charge.

There are currently 148 venues in Toronto screening World Cup games, with 19 of them including match parties, and some of the standout spots including Sankofa Square, Fox on John, and Mangal Kebab House.

Users are able to browse the map for all the screening locations, including the name and location of the venue, a description of the event, whether they include any special deals, and a star rating by reviewers.

The tool also includes filters, which allow users to search for watch parties for specific games, venue types, and specific teams.

The map will be refreshed daily through the final World Cup game, which will take place on July 19.
