

How to watch in Ontario

The biggest FIFA World Cup in history that saw an all-time high 48 nations competing is now down to just eight teams.

The quarterfinals are set to begin Thursday, July 9, headlined by the likes of football legend Lionel Messi's Argentina, Kylian Mbappé's France and Erling Haaland's Norway.

Here is the upcoming schedule and which teams remain, along with how and where you can watch the matches in Ontario.

Which teams are in the FIFA World Cup 2026 quarterfinals?

France vs. Morocco

Kicking off the FIFA World Cup quarterfinals on Thursday, July 9 is a heavyweight matchup between France and Morocco at 4 p.m. at Boston Stadium.

During the Round of 16, France eliminated Paraguay by a score of 1-0 to advance to the quarterfinal, while Morocco ended Canada's dream run with a 3-0 win.

In the 2022 World Cup, France fell to Argentina in the World Cup final in one of the most talked about games of this generation, while Morocco made history by making it to the semifinals for the first time in team history.

In their six head-to-head matches all time, France has won four times. The last these two nations faced each other was at the 2022 World Cup in Qatar where France eliminated Morocco in the semifinal with a 2-0 victory.

Kylian Mbappé leads the way in scoring for France with seven goals in the tournament, while the now injured Ismael Sabari is Morocco's top scorer in the tournament with three.

Spain vs. Belgium

One of the favourites to win it all, Spain, will be taking on Belgium in a Friday, July 10 clash that is scheduled for 3 p.m. at Los Angeles Stadium.

Spain was eliminated by Morocco in penalties in the 2022 World Cup quarterfinal, while Belgium failed to advance past the group stage four years ago.

In this year's Round of 16, Spain's narrow victory over Portugal saw them advance to the quarterfinal, while Belgium's 4-1 statement win against the United States in a controversial affair earned them a spot in the quarterfinal.

Head-to-head all time, the two nations have face each other a total of 22 times, with Spain leading the way with 12 victories. Their last matchup was back in 2016 when Spain beat Belgium 2-0 in an international friendly.

Mikel Oyarzabal currently leads Spain with four goals scored, while Belgium is led by Romelu Lukaku's three goals.

England vs. Norway

A dream Saturday, July 11 schedule for soccer fans across the world begins at 5 p.m. with a showdown at Miami Stadium between England and Norway.

England is coming off an epic 3-2 win over co-host nation Mexico in the Round of 16, while Norway took down football giants Brazil with a stunning 2-1 victory thanks to two goals from superstar Erling Haaland.

In the 2022 World Cup, England bowed out early in the quarterfinals with a 2-1 loss to finalists France, while Norway is enjoying its first FIFA World Cup tournament in 28 years.

Head-to-head all time, the two nations have played each other 12 times internationally, with England winning seven of those matches.

Norway is led by Erling Haaland's seven goals in his FIFA World Cup debut, while Harry Kane leads the way for England with six goals of his own.

Argentina vs. Switzerland

Rounding out the slate of quarterfinal matches is defending World Cup champion Argentina, which will take on Switzerland at Kansas City Stadium on Saturday, July 11 at 9 p.m.

Argentina is coming off a suspenseful 3-2 comeback victory over Egypt in the Round of 16, while Switzerland took down Colombia in penalty kicks shortly after to earn a spot in the quarterfinal.

In the 2022 World Cup, Argentina won its first World Cup since 1986 and third all-time, while Switzerland fell 6-1 to Portugal in the Round of 16.

Head-to-head all time, Argentina and Switzerland have only played each other seven times, with Argentina coming on top in five of those matches.

Lionel Messi continues his historic, record-breaking international career with a tournament-leading eight goals, standing alone all-time in total World Cup goals with 21. Switzerland is led by Johan Manzambi, who has three goals so far in this tournament.

Where to watch the FIFA World Cup quarterfinals in Ontario

Toronto hosted its final game of the tournament at Toronto Stadium on July 2, while the final game at Vancouver Stadium was held on July 7.

While there are no more games left on Canadian soil, there are still plenty of ways to catch the upcoming World Cup matches.

A live, interactive map, which is the creation of Amsterdam startup [Dashmote](#), lists more than 300 watch parties daily where fans can gather to watch any match in the tournament.

[Watch Party Radar](#), Dashmote's tool, enables users to locate verified screening events across Ontario. This includes venue details, event descriptions, special offers, ratings and even a

search by specific team.

To find a particular match, click on the date of choice and find it in the list of that day's schedule, with a live selection of locations appearing that can be filtered in various ways such as outdoor venues, big screens, kid friendly and even dog-friendly venues.
